

Walker River Indian Reserve
Nov 8th 1866

Dear Sister

Your very interesting letter of date – in which you acknowledge the receipt of photograph etc. came to hand several days ago.

In it you incidentally referred to a bounty which Grand Mother has received an to cousin Evelin being with her husband which is most gratifying intelligence.

Tell Mr. Wood, I mailed him a letter the same day that I did yours and Grand Mother, which contained a photgraph and some money for the children (fifteen dollars I believe). The way you expended the money is perfectly satisfactory. If you will send the necessary paper of conveyance I will sign them and give you a quit claim to all my right title and interest in the old house free of charge.

My prospects are not as good as they were. "My policy" wont go down, which makes it pretty certain that any officialhead must come off.

Well I have had the honor of the appointment and if the dictator will keep heaping more on me by cutting my head off, why so make it be.

Please in form me in your next what were the politics of the Sutton family and other Democrat relatives.

You may not know it but I will tell you that I am not very fond of Cops.

I received a letter not long since from David McCollum. He was on his way to Helena Montana Ter. – was well and getting \$55. per month for driving mule team.

As usual I am well write soon and direct to Fort Churchill
