My dear one -

I am here going to drill for a while and see if I can strike something.

I closed the Pine Creek prospect down, it ran up as high as \$18.00 per ton and then down to 80 cents in the bottom of shaft.

Am going to start in drilling on the No. 6 below discovery, on Anvil and see if I can't get on the Little Creek beach line, every one seems to think there is a good chance there.

Tom has taken a lay on the Quartz Mine, so his flusy and the boys are going there to live, going in a few days. Tom has the mumps. I saw by the paper that M. bins the crazy man, who on the Ohio going out umped over board, so you had a little excitement.

There are no boats here now, but one is expected any day now and may bring me a letter from my only dear one whom is, I think at 58 Horton, and still good. I have been and will be, till I see you in the fall at Seattle.

Jack Woodson was up this eve for dinner, is working at Gisse's(?), Wade was down and went back yesterday.

Silas is in town gambling as usual, came down to see the Dr. nothing much the matter though just an excuse,

Will write you again as soon as I get started drilling and every few days, as I will be here so I will know when boats are leaving and can get letters often to you.

All are well here
