Nov. 25, 1906

My dearest:

I stopped here on my way down from Redding, found Mr. & Mrs. Diggs the same as of later they wanted to know all about all of you & all about Alaska.

Mr. Diggs & I went to see a ranch about five miles from here, yesterday it belongs to a Stockton man, to whom I wrote last night to get his terms, as the place is just the kind of a place I have had in mind lots of feed, has 2200 acres & just this thing if I can get it right.

Today we are going to the Fair ranch, it is a 9000 acre stock ranch, their stock have run down & etc. & they want to lease Mr. Diggs thinks, it is the ranch that was left to Mrs. herman Olrich, so will hae to see her about it when I go back to to the city, which will be in a few days. I want to hear from the Stockton man first. Mr. Diggs says tell you that he will see that I don't get into any worse company than he does. Mrs. Diggs is very much in hopes that I can find something that suits around here so she can have us for neighbors, she is planning where we can live close to them, fine school here, those besides high school. I would like to locate you here if things turn out right.

All ways address my letters to Palo Alto then I can know where to look for mail.

This is their coldest time of year here now & isn't very bad, its winter, so they say.
